Principal Brian Jolley was hired to open the new middle school in Eagle Mountain. With Cedar Valley High School at over 3,000 students and Frontier Middle School at almost 1,900, the school was needed to ease the strain. Sage Canyon opened its doors this past August with 1,550 students. Principal Jolley had been preparing for over a year by hiring staff and establishing their purpose and shared commitments.
