**4. 2026 Utah Legislative Session**

The legislative session will soon begin. Thank you for being willing to **connect and communicate** with your local legislators. It is important that we stay informed and ensure that our voices are heard when it comes to educational decisions. The following is a current list of things that we encourage you to talk about: (see the Power Hour review for details)

- A. Continue funding CTSO's at the state level. *Tell Your Story* about the importance for students.
- B. Ask NOT to pull the \$17M back from schools that was allocated to help with school fees.
- C. PRESS PAUSE – Some states have a law that only allows education bills every other year. That gives schools/districts time to stay caught up (or at least try).
- D. Governor's Literacy Focus – Secondary schools also need interventions for students that have continued through the system without learning how to read.
- E. If there is any safety money that will be allocated this year, we want it to go directly to the schools for their safety plans.
